Maritimes Beef Testing Society has reached 50 years in testing bulls and providing an annual bull sale that showcases the top genetics from their members. AgSights has supported Maritimes farmers for many years. We look forward to re-evaluating how the value of data collected by sellers can be demonstrated to bull buyers to support their decisions. In a closed herd, the new genetics entering the herd will come completely from the bulls selected. Following three generations of retained heifers, 87.5% of the genetic make-up of herd when retaining replacements, is a direct results of the last three bulls purchased. Based on test results of the 2023 bulls, the bulls being sold have the following genetic variation: 59.8 lbs weaning gain, 101 lbs post weaning gain, 1.32 square inches of rib eye, 0.68% intramuscular fat and 1.76 lbs per day feed efficiency. The balance is finding the right bull that builds on your herds genetic strengths and improves productivity for traits that need more focus. Chasing one trait at a time can lead into future challenges.
